Sue Reynolds Native American Exhibit Arrives at The People’s Center Museum & Gift Shop in Pablo, MT

Celebrates Tribal Culture & Museum’s 20th Anniversary

January 13, 2011, Walnut Creek, CA – Photographer Sue Reynolds’ stunningly vibrant exhibit, “Understanding Native American People,” arrives at The People’s Center museum in Pablo, Montana on Tuesday, June 28th, just in time for powwow season. This exhibit’s 26 images inspire and offer a new understanding within the historical context of what it means to be Native American today. New images have been added to the exhibit, which first opened in 2009 in San Francisco.

Marie Torosian, Education Director for The People’s Center, says, “Sue creates beautiful photographs and words from her strong connection with Native people across the West. We are happy to have her exhibit here on the Flathead reservation because it offers visitors another view of how Native American Tribes celebrate life.”

Opening Reception, Artist’s Tour, Art & Book Sales

The photographer will speak and give an Artist’s Tour of the exhibit on June 28th at a free opening reception at The People’s Center, from 5pm to 7pm. Her behind-the-scenes

stories include Native perspectives from many tribes, including the Salish, P'end d'Oreille, Kootenai, Crow, Nez Perce and Lakota peoples.

Sue Reynolds Background

Sue Reynolds is a fine arts photographer, photojournalist and writer. Her current focus is honoring Native Americans, while creating greater understanding and respect for them among non-native audiences. Reynolds has exhibited, published and taught photography since 2002 and has written for national media since 1990. Since 2005, she has photographed American Indian celebrations across the West, especially in Montana. Her Native American and landscape images have been featured in solo shows in San Francisco, other Northern California cities, and in Tokyo and Yokohama, Japan. They are in collections nationwide.

Reynolds has studied with Rocky Mountain School of Photography in Missoula, Montana, holds a B.A. in Art History from University of California, Davis, and an M.B.A. from San Francisco State University.
